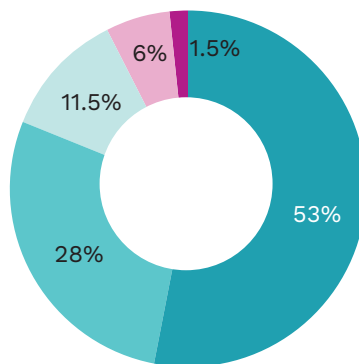
Ovarian cancer survival rates compared to breast and prostate cancer after 5 years

Almost 9 in 10 (85%) men diagnosed with prostate cancer in England and Wales survive their disease for five years or more.

Almost 9 in 10 (87%) women diagnosed with breast cancer in England and Wales survive their disease for five years or more.

HOWEVER: Less than half (46%) of women diagnosed with ovarian cancer in England and Wales survive their disease for five years or more.

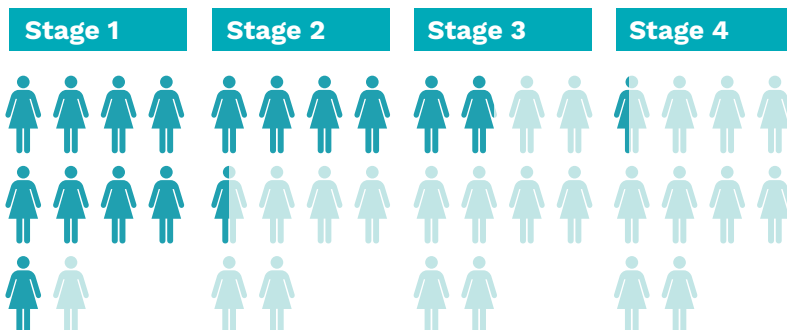

The biggest gynaecological killer

Ovarian cancer kills more women in the UK than the other four gynae cancers (womb, cervical, vaginal and vulval) combined.

● Ovarian: 4,128 ● Vulval: 453
● Womb: 2,166 ● Vaginal: 110
● Cervical: 890



Ovarian cancer survival rates by stage of diagnosis after 5 years

Early detection makes a big difference. Women diagnosed at stage 1 have a 90% survival rate compared to 19% at stage 3.

Only 33% are diagnosed at stage one. 58% of cases are diagnosed at a later stage (stages three and four).
